"The Eternal One has made a covenant with us, Asherah has made a pact with us."

7th Century BC

(cf, Deuteronomy 29:12,14)



Hittite Suzerain Treaties (14/13C) Six Elements

Preamble

"These are the words of King ..."

Historical Prologue

Setting out relationship between the Hittite King and his subjects ...

Requirements

No alliances with other kings Answer a call to arms Treatment of refugees Prizes of war No murmuring or rebellion

Deposit & Public Reading

Written on stones

List of Witnesses

Usually the gods of both peoples

Blessings and curses

What the gods will do in response to obedience or disobedience

Deuteronomy Six Elements Mirrored?

Preamble - Deut 1

"These are the words that Moses spoke to all Israel ...The LORD our God spoke to us at Horeb, saying ..."

Historical Prologue - Deut 1-10
 What God has done for his people ...

• Requirements - Deut 11-27

"You shall love the LORD your God" "Keep this entire commandment"

Deposit and Public Reading - Deut 27,31
 Written on plastered stones
 Book of Law deposited by / in the ark
 Law to be read every 7 years

List of Witnesses - Deut 31
 Book of Law by in the ark to be a witness

Blessings and curses - Deut 11, 27-33
 What God will do in response to his people's obedience or disobedience


Types of Covenant

- Covenant with David







Hammurabi Stele




Types of Law

Case / Conditional Law (Casuistic)




